Why this research?

Community engagement approaches are often emphasized across global health interventions, **but** there is **little guidance** on **how** this community engagement **is done & what makes it work**. This study fills this gap by exploring how a community engagement intervention in Zambia, the Safe Motherhood Action Groups (SMAGs), improve maternal health care-seeking.

What have I found?





- 2 Using simple language, real-life stories, humor, and audience participation were described as useful ways to share important health information.
- 3 Important motivating factors for SMAGs include seeing value in the work they do and a desire to help the community.
- While community engagement work is often voluntary, there is a need for fiscal and physical resources to sustain activities.



Why does it matter?

These findings provide practical lessons that can be translated across settings. By outlining what makes community engagement work, these findings will be shared with the Zambian Ministry of Health and other stakeholders to inform recommendations and future community engagement programmes.
